A good set of pencils would be three of each of the following: 6B, 4B, 2B, HB, 2H, 4H, and 6H. If you are unable to find all or are able to find an even better variety, purchase them.

* **Kneadable Erasers**

These are soft, pliable, and usually come in a gray color. They are individually wrapped in plastic. If you stumble across some, pick up a couple for yourself.

* **A Set of Acrylic and Watercolor Brushes**

Keeping brushes in good painting shape is a problem for any school. For your personal use, it is recommended that you purchase a set of small brushes for each medium. The larger brushes we have in the art room are easier to clean and stay better kept throughout the year.

* **Magazines with Good Photographs**

Harare has a very limited supply of imported magazines. The photographs used throughout the year are important visual images utilized for predatory composition studies.

- Camera – During the two years, both SL and HL IB artists will need to frequently document their progression in their Research Workbook. Having a camera (a good cheap one would be great) available for individual use would save a lot of money and time. Not all students will be ready to photograph on the same days. Each student having their own will eliminate wasted film and time.
- Sketchbooks (RWB)– Students will need to have two A4 spiral-bound sketchbooks with a minimum of 75 pages in each. The books need to be of good quality with a hard front and back cover. A thin paper cover will not withstand the beating these books are going to take. The sketchbook (RWB) accounts for 30% of the overall grade in IB.
- Portfolio – While students are given space to store their artwork, it is highly advised that a portfolio be purchased. The portfolio should have handles, a strong zipper, and be as large as possible. Exact size specifications can not be given seeing that the exact size of the future artwork has not yet been designated.
- Kneadable Erasers – These are soft and usually gray erasers that are very valuable when working in charcoal and pencil. These have never been seen at the local Zimbabwean art supply stores.
- Drawing/Shading Pencils – A set or two of 8 to 14 good pencils will be utilized throughout the year. The art department supplies pencils, but there may not be the variety and the pencil supply can be depleted before the final days of school.
- Brushes – While the art department supplies students with brushes for watercolor, acrylic, and oil painting; these brushes are used by over a hundred students and the resulting state of the brushes is poor by the third quarter. Personal brushes for watercolor and acrylic would be a wise decision. Sets of smaller brushes are all that's needed.

Personal brushes for watercolor and acrylic would be a wise decision. Sets of smaller brushes are all that's needed.

12th GRADE COMPUTER REQUIRED MATERIALS:

High school students should have Microsoft Office 2003 including; Word, Excel and PowerPoint as well as access to E-mail/Internet from home. Each student should also have a flash disk of at least 128MB to store their work on. The school will be selling a limited number of flash disks next year; they will be \$30US for a 256 MB flash disk. If they are not proficient typist, they should have Mavis Beacon Teaches Typing 15 or a similar typing tutor.

- USB Drive – Should be at least 1 GB.
- Sketchbook - Students will need to have one A4 spiral-bound sketchbook with a minimum of 50 pages. The books need to be of good quality with a hard front and back cover, the pages can be lined or blank (white).
- Laptop (not required) – If students own a portable computer they are encouraged to bring them to class to work with. Certain software can be installed on the machines and it easier for students to take projects home with them.

12th GRADE PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH KIT REQUIREMENTS:

Students are required to have a T-shirt, shorts, or sweat pants, and tennis shoes. They are also required to have a water bottle, hat and sunscreen for outdoor activities.

I would suggest that students purchase several pairs of shorts and a pair of sweat pants or jogging uniform for the colder weather. At least one sweat shirt along with several t-shirts. I would also recommend several pairs of tennis shoes as they tend to wear out and the students grow out of them. It is also a good idea to buy several pair of white socks. Please also pick up several hats and sunscreen. Students don't realize how hard the sun can be on their bodies here in Harare. If they are comfortable with the hat they will wear it. If not it becomes a problem for them.
